# General Information

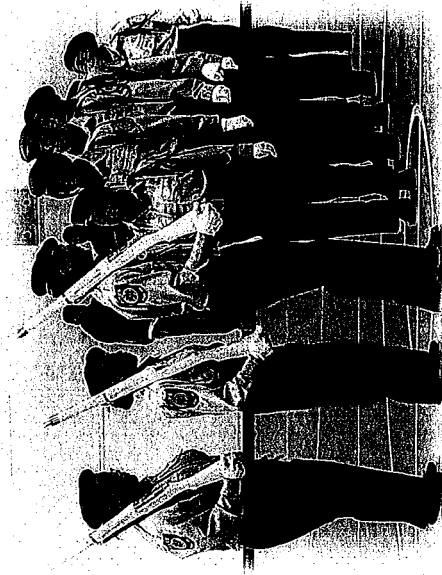

# Requirements

- 14-20 years old at time of application and appointment
- Grade Point Average of 2.5 or greater
- Currently attending high school or accredited college or university
- U.S. citizen or applying for citizenship at time of appointment
- No felony convictions
- Submit application, and pass interview and background check
- Valid student identification, California Identification Card, or California Driver License
- Perform community service for a minimum of 8-24 hours per quarter
- Attend weekly cadet meetings
- Small cost for equipment

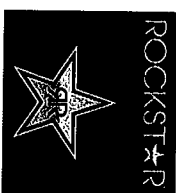

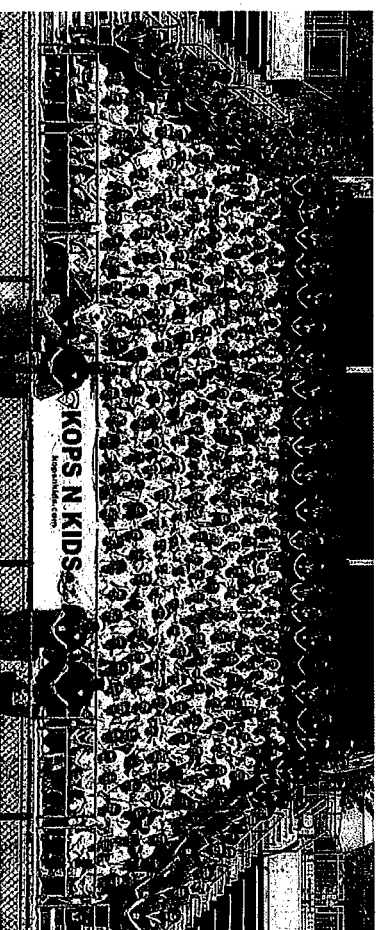
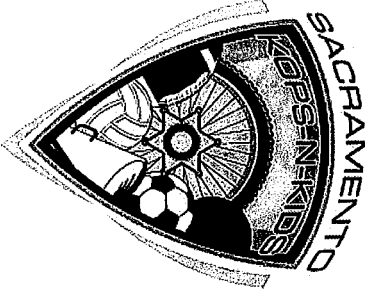
