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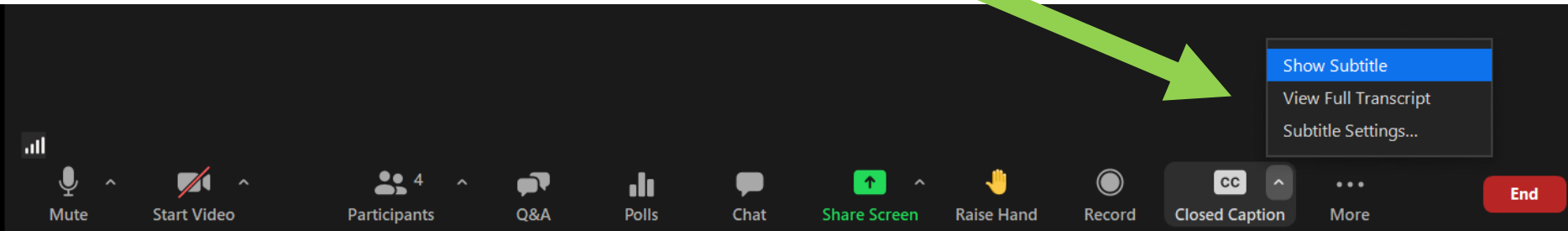

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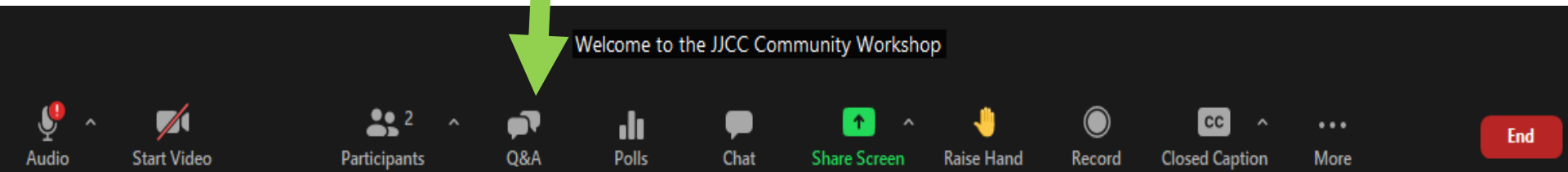

# Senate Bill (SB) 823

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- Beginning July 1, 2021, the state will begin to phase out the California Division of Juvenile Justice (DJJ) by ceasing transfers from counties to state facilities
- Youth will instead remain in local settings near families and the community, under the supervision of county probation departments
- Currently the Sacramento County Youth Detention Facility (YDF) houses youth up to age 18. Under DJJ Realignment youth up to the age of 25 will be housed at the YDF.

# JJCC Subcommittee Membership Openings

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- Currently accepting applications for at least three community members who are defined as individuals who have experience:
  - Providing community-based youth services,
  - Youth justice advocates with expertise and knowledge of the juvenile justice system, or
  - Have been directly involved in the juvenile justice system.

# JJCC Subcommittee Membership Duties

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- Develop the DJJ Realignment Plan per 1995 (a) of the Welfare and Institutions Code.
- The plan will describe the facilities, programs, placements, services, supervision and reentry strategies needed to provide appropriate rehabilitation and supervision services for youth who are realigned from the state DJJ.
- The goal is to finalize the plan for submission to the Board of Supervisors during Fiscal Year 2021-22 budget proceedings.
