Potentially partnering with YOLO County In supporting their population

• There's been conversations with YOLO county with possibly partnering with them – pre and post SB823. We've yet to get to a yes. We haven't engaged in with any negotiation yet. They're also doing their own due diligence is regards to other county's as well. The challenge is really wanting to ensure we have adequate space for our traditional youth and VOYA youth and managing where those thresholds are. Should those youth from YOLO push us over the threshold, it could cause us to open another unit. There is potentially an upside due to their numbers, we just want to be cautious.

RFI Results

• No updates as of 12/14/21 for the RFI results. We have not heard anything back from county counsel.

Focus Groups

- Dennis Dulay would like to be on the facilities focus group.
- Marc Nigel is interested in the re-entry focus group.

Rollover Funds

 We believe the funds would have to be expended by the end of the fiscal year and liquated by some period short after. However, this needs to be confirmed - Chief Yarber to follow up.

Juvenile Support Coordinator and Youth Mentor

This proposed role responsibilities for the support coordinator may include:

- Creating a plan for the youth and communicating the plan to the youth.
 - o Method of communication could be a PowerPoint, flowchart, or other process diagram.
- Holding plan reviews with the youth to determine progress through the program.
- Since the proposed Juvenile Support Coordinator shares very similar responsibilities with Probation's Deputy
 Probation Officer case owners, we will need to learn more about the scope of the DPO case owners in the
 VOYA unit.
- The coordinator and the youth mentor would be perhaps two different people. The mentor could eventually be a transitional specialist as well.

VOYA Staff

- VOYA staff are selected based on their knowledge and experience they demonstrated while in the institution. They were sent to a specialized transfer academy for DPOs. They received one on one training with the field officers in re-entry and Juvenile Field on how to do case plans and write court reports. We asked these DPO case workers to understand that they more than likely will stay in the VOYA unit for two years to set a foundation in these units and staying consistent, while officers in other units will be transferred.
- The majority of YDF is staffed with Assistant Probation Officers. There are very few Deputy Probation Officers
 four currently as part of the programming unit.
