Crisis Intervention

- All youth are assessed within 24 hours of arrival in the facility
 - Emergency Response:
 - Next available clinician
 - Resident placed in Observation Room, suicide gesture/attempt, unstable youth
 - Urgent Response:
 - Within 24 hours of referral
 - Threat of suicide, exhibiting symptoms of psychosis, admitted to YDF
 - Routine Response:
 - Within 72 hours of referral
 - Adjustment issues, anxiety/panic, self-injurious behavior, conflict with staff and/or peers, anger issues

S-5 Classification:

- Weekly follow-up
- Serious mental illness, circumstances that significantly impairs ability to function and respond to demands of incarceration
- Schizophrenia, Bipolar D/O, Developmental Delays

Daily Unit Rounds:

- Check in with staff, discuss youth on the rounds list
- Collect self-referrals, staff referrals
- Triage youth to assess the urgency of the request/referral

Collaborative Programs

- Special Needs Meeting
 - Multidisciplinary Team
 - Weekly staffing for referred residents
 - Action Plans



Re-Entry Team

- Provide input on referrals for services in the community to address youth's needs
- Weekly staffing for selected youth
- Child, Family Team Meetings
- Multidisciplinary Team Meetings

•Description: The SacEDAPT Clinic provides coordinated specialty care (CSC) for individuals experiencing their first episode of psychotic symptoms or early warning signs of these symptoms. Care is delivered in an outpatient setting with the goals of early diagnosis, treatment, and disability prevention. SacEDAPT has a strong and diverse interdisciplinary team of physicians, clinicians, support staff, and peer and family advocates with unique expertise in state-of-the-art assessments and evidence-based practices for early identification and intervention for psychotic disorders.

Serves:

- •Sacramento County residents ages 12 to 30, Medi-Cal eligible OR uninsured
- •Experiencing symptoms of early psychosis, including Onset of psychotic symptoms in the past 2 years
- •Subthreshold psychotic symptoms
- •Recent deterioration in youth with a parent/sibling with a psychotic disorder

The Source—916 Support



The Source is a 24/7/365 call center that provides immediate phone response, mobile inperson/face-to-face crisis intervention, triage services, mediation, follow-up support, and information and referral services to all children and youth and their caregivers or natural supports who are experiencing crisis, emotional or behavioral distress.

Services include peer mentoring, youth and family engagement, support and advocacy, and temporary relief for youth and/or their caregivers or natural supports, and provide opportunities for foster youth and former foster youth to participate in activities.

Mental Health Urgent Care Clinic (MHUCC)

For Sacramento Residents having a mental health crisis and may need linkage to mental health services. If unlinked youth are having an urgent mental health need, they can be assessed by MHUCC.

• Peer and family support

• Psychiatric medication evaluation, excluding controlled medications (no medication is kept on site)

• Integrated co-occurring mental health and substance abuse crisis assessment

• Crisis intervention and counseling to avert the need for inpatient hospitalization

• Referral and linkage to on-going services and community supports
