



**Youth Detention Facility
OPERATIONS ORDER**

**MEDICAL CLEARANCE/INTAKE HEALTH AND
SCREENING - TITLE XV 1430**

Purpose and Scope

All youth brought into the Youth Detention Facility shall receive a health screening procedure immediately upon entry into the facility by health care personnel and prior to their acceptance into custody.

I. Guidelines

- A. Upon the youths' arrival, booking staff will review the arrest report and consult with law enforcement personnel in regard to the youths' medical condition, use of drugs and/or alcohol. Law enforcement will complete the pertinent portion of the Medical Admission form.
- B. Booking staff shall alert the Duty Supervisor and ensure youth who are unconscious, semi-conscious, profusely bleeding, severely disorientated, known to have ingested substances, intoxicated to the extent that they are a threat to their own safety or the safety of others, in alcohol or drug withdrawal or otherwise urgently in need of medical attention shall be immediately referred to an outside facility for medical attention and clearance for booking.
- C. Duty Supervisor shall be notified of a youth's medical condition, drug or alcohol use, if it is significant, prior to accepting the youth into custody.
- D. The Duty Supervisor will request clinic staff examine the youth for fitness for incarceration.

- E. The clinic staff will then report their findings to the Duty Supervisor who will make the final decision as to the acceptance of the youth into custody.

- F. If the youth has been medically cleared from an outside medical facility and law enforcement presents proper documentation, the clinic staff will be asked to review such documentation. Clinic staff will report their findings to the Duty Supervisor as to the minor's suitability for acceptance into custody.
