AGE OF MAJORITY

Specialized field unit providing case management services and support to young people 18-21 years of age under Juvenile Court Jurisdiction





ELIGIBILITY AND CRITERIA

The target population of the Age of Majority unit are Wards of the Court ages 18-21 who are not currently enrolled in High School or have already obtained their diploma. The AOM unit does not supervise youth assigned to specialized supervision units such as Juvenile Sex Offenders, Division of Juvenile Justice (DJJ), Black Child Legacy Campaign (BCLC) or Juvenile Justice Diversion Treatment Program (JDTP).

GOALS AND STRUCTURE OF AOM

The goal of the Age of Majority Unit is to provide clients with assessment, treatment, supervision, and support necessary to promote rehabilitation and to prevent further re-offending, resulting in a safer community. The unit consists of 6 armed field DPO's who work in the community, two DPO's who make contacts in the office and one DPO intake coordinator who is in charge of initial assessments, linking youth to appropriate programs and services, tracking/stats and acting as a liaison with treatment providers.

Probation Officers assigned to the AOM unit have continuous contact with probationers in the community and in the office, conducted probation searches, make arrests, recover firearms, narcotics and ammunition and referred clients to service and treatment providers in Sacramento County.
