Overview

The State Fiscal Year 2011-12 Budget includes the realigning of state-local programs that redirects authority and responsibility to the local level, with associated funding. This realignment effort proposes to eliminate duplicative administration of services, limit overhead costs, and allow for locally determined priorities while maintaining statewide goals and objectives. As part of the realignment plan, a Community Corrections Partnership Executive Committee is being formed to develop and recommend a local plan to the Board of Supervisors on how public safety realignment should be implemented within the County. One of the members of this committee needs to be the head of the county department of social services, mental health, or alcohol and substance abuse programs.

Recommendation

Adopt the attached resolution designating Bruce Wagstaff, Administrator of the Countywide Services Agency, to the Community Corrections Partnership Executive Committee.

Fiscal Impact

There is no fiscal impact associated with this recommendation.

BACKGROUND

The State Fiscal Year 2011-12 Budget includes the realigning of state-local programs that returns authority and responsibility to the local level, with associated funding. This realignment effort proposes to eliminate duplicative administration of services, limit overhead costs, and allow for locally determined priorities while maintaining statewide goals and objectives. On April 4, 2011, the Governor signed into law AB 109 shifting major public safety programs from the state to the counties. AB 109 also established an executive committee of each County's Community Corrections Partnership.

On Tuesday June 28, 2011, the Legislature finalized action on the Fiscal Year 2011-12 state budget, sending eight new bills and some previously approved bills to the Governor for his consideration. The budget plan, via AB 117, revised the duties and composition of the Community Corrections Partnership (CCP) Executive Committee as previously enacted in AB 109. These changes resulted

from negotiations among stakeholders in recognition of the responsibilities assigned to the CCP to develop and present an AB 109 implementation plan to the board of supervisors. The changes are noted below:

- Recasts the CCP Executive Committee to include the following seven members: chief probation officer as chair; presiding judge or designee; district attorney; public defender; sheriff; a chief of police; and one of the following: the head of the county department of social services, mental health, or alcohol and substance abuse programs, as designated by the board of supervisors.
- Specifies that the executive committee vote on the final AB 109 implementation plan that is to be presented to the county board of supervisors.
- Provides that the county board of supervisors can reject the AB 109 implementation plan as submitted by the CCP with a four-fifths vote of the board; if the plan is rejected it is referred back to the entire CCP for revision.
- Gives the board of supervisors the flexibility to appoint a designee (other than the CAO or a board member) to the 14-member CCP.

DISCUSSION

AB 117 changed the composition of the Community Corrections Partnership Executive Committee previously enacted by AB 109. One of the members of this committee needs to be the head of the county department of social services, mental health, or alcohol and substance abuse programs. Under the current county structure, the social services, mental health, and alcohol and substance abuse programs reside within the Countywide Services Agency; therefore, it is recommended that the Board designate Bruce Wagstaff, Administrator of the Countywide Services Agency, to the CCP Executive Committee.
