<p>OYCR completed a visit at YDF and positive feedback was received afterwards. Pinegrove cost has been reduced from \$95,000 per youth per year to approximately \$5,000 per year. The contract for Pinegrove has been approved by the Board of Supervisors. The Title 15 and 24 regulation revisions process is underway and the first meetings are December 2nd and 3rd. Probation was able to attend a webinar with BSCC in regards to Sight and Sound where the federal law states any youth who have been arrested after age 18 and in custody at an adult facility can't be housed in YDF with general population and need to be housed out of sight and sound. BSCC Youth Transitional Housing contract has been awarded to Amity. The new VOYA commitment count is at 22 with 1 or 2 potential females. There are also two youth who may be released soon. The field project is underway and the alarm and electronics project is back to square one as the vendor selected can't fulfil all the needs.</p>

<p>The budget for fiscal year (FY) 21-22 provided funding for one housing unit and the Stanford contract. The FY 22-23 has currently provided funds for two housing units, a Behavioral Health Services Psychiatrist, Stanford contract, Pinegrove contract, Hope contract, housing contract, community advocate position, one Public Defender, one teacher and transition specialist through SCOE, a Senior Deputy Probation Officer for the re-entry team, and additional contracts for services. There is still funds available but there is also possibility of the population growing mid fiscal year and these funds would be utilized to support that population</p>

<p>SCOE and DCFAS have positions with similar job descriptions that could be utilized as a starting point. Chief Yarber nominated Josef Gray and Nina Acosta/Dr. Quist to work on a job description for the position.
